An additional winner was Neill Alferd who won an Illustrated guide to Astronomy Wonders.

The meeting presentation was by Jason Tackett. His presentation was entitled: The CALIPSO Mission – Understand Aerosol & Cloud Influence on Climate with Lasers in Space. It is a series of satellites that use green and near infrared lasers that measure natural & human generated aerosols. They are naked eye safe, but not through a telescope. Highlights were seeing Sahara desert dust over the Atlantic Ocean & the Caribbean; Siberian summer fire smoke that even reached Virginia in 5/14/2012. Volcanic eruptions were also visible.
