Guest Speaker:

Dr. Kunio Sayanagi spoke on the "Decadal Survey" (10 year survey) for NASA projects. Kunio was directly involved in the proposal for sending a probe to the planet Uranus. The National Academy is an independent non-profit organization that studies science research. Four Branches: Planetary Science, Human Exploration, Astrophysics, and Helio-physics. Spoke on several aspects of evaluation and investing in several of the panels that he is a member. A 600 page document is edited and becomes the final report. Mars gets about 50% of the planetary funding. By studying our outer planetary systems, we can extrapolate that information to exoplanet study in "hot Jupiters". Both Jupiter and Saturn radiate more heat than they receive from our Sun. Dr. Sayanagi received a rousing applause from our members.
