ALCOR Report: (Bruce Powers)

Bruce gave an overview of what the Astronomical League mission does and that they publish a quarterly magazine, The Reflector. Inside this magazine, you will find a list of awards that have been awarded over the previous three months. BBAA members' names are mentioned quite often.

Bruce has posted five information sheets that the Astronomical League generated. The first one was information on the upcoming lunar eclipse on November 8. New Business:

Rachel Perry suggested that the BBAA conduct an astronomy course like the one Richard Bell of the Kalamazoo Astronomical Society presented last Spring.

The city of Chesapeake is in the planning stage of rezoning 1,400 acres of farmland for a 'mega' industrial park. This land is very close to Northwest River and Cornland parks, where the club holds many observing events. Per the Virginia Pilot, "In a meeting this week, city leaders said Chesapeake is moving quickly on the rezoning request because the competitive grant funding is expected to be given out by the end of the calendar year." It will significantly affect the views to the west from both NWRP and Cornland. Shawn suggested we require that lighting conforms with International Dark Sky lighting requirements. A poll was created on the Groups.io website regarding the age requirement of officers within the BBAA. The proposal is to remove the age requirement for all officers listed in Article V and change Article IV section 4.03 The wording of the poll was "4.03 Qualifications of Office.

Any regular or honorary club member in good standing with the desire and ability to fulfill the obligations set forth in Article V of this document for the open role shall be eligible for all officer positions." With only 28 members voting and 20 of these members voting to disapprove,

there will be no change to this age requirement rule. The proposal failed. The minimum age requirement to serve as President, Vice President and Secretary will remand at 20 years of age. The office of Treasurer will remand at 21 years of age.
